

GUIDE for research paper, Economics

For this mission, you will choose a subject of analysis in economics, related to the topics indicated in the subject sheet valid this academic year, available on your personal page, to write a research report. In your paper, you should use the materials presented in class, as well as at least one additional material of your choice (as derived from the discipline sheet, or other chosen materials approved by the coordinating teacher), considered necessary to substantiate the study of the chosen subject. in the field of economics. The topics chosen must refer strictly to purely economic aspects of the course coverage.

Guidance in choosing the topic of analysis:

First, could you identify the component of economic manifestation in a certain real situation, for example why do actors in a certain industry behave or make decisions in a certain sense? Secondly, you could focus the study on the societal consequences (understood at national and European level) produced by economic phenomena. For assistance in choosing the subject of study, you can present in a written form the chosen subject accompanied by a few lines (8-12) in which to show what you propose.

The paper must have a minimum of 5 pages and a maximum of 8. The text must be entered using Times New Roman 12 size, in two lines. Papers must be submitted in electronic format (which can be sent using the email addresses indicated) until January 18. Do not forget to specify on the first page of this study your name and surname and the faculty where you are a student, along with the statement "EQUIVALENCE NOTE" (the same phrase please be used as the subject of the email message by which you send your research paper).

The appreciation of the paper will be based on: the clarity and organization of the presentation; the degree of representativeness of the data; supporting ideas through scientific theories and mentions; The work should begin by providing a statement of research intentions. Then, it should provide a brief overview of the topic highlighting the most important aspects of the topic and treatment. Ideas that summarize only the reading of bibliographic materials are not enough. Writing a paper should provide a critical analysis of the ideas presented. A critical analysis goes deeper than simply,

disagreeing / agreeing with the author or emphasizing what you think was left in the author's argument. You can, for example, evaluate the main contribution of an article on your chosen topic. Or, you could talk about ways in which the author's perspective can be refined or continued.

Other suggestions:

1. Please cite the sources. Paraphrases or quotations directly from the texts must be explicitly mentioned.
2. Use ideas from different articles, in addition to the one you are analyzing, to support your views.
3. Please reread and check the spelling.
4. Do not use the Internet (especially Wikipedia) as a source outside of situations where the articles used are from scientific journals or you are offered books published in recognized publishers and statistical data from representative organizations.

Categories of works:

A: papers: well written, clear theses, convincing critical analysis.

B: The critical analysis is less strong than the one above, but overall the work is good.

C: A good summary, but it doesn't have a critical analysis and overall it's not very clear.

D: The abstract is not well written and the paper lacks any kind of critical analysis.
